

#### FROM FR. KEN

Whenever you have a group of non-Catholics come to Mass, you inevitably have questions, like "How do you know when and why to stand, kneel, and sit?" When is something that we know by celebrating, why is different. Sometimes the different postures we do at Mass are jokingly called Catholic Calisthenics, but they actually do mean something. Each part of the Mass has a different posture and a reason for that posture. Standing is a posture that tells us we are ready to do something, to come or go it is also a posture of honor and respect. We stand at the beginning and end of Mass because we are coming or going. We stand during the Gospel as a sign of respect for the words of Christ; the Gospels hold a higher place among the rest of the word of God because they are directly related to Christ's bodily time on this earth. Sitting is a posture of listening and meditation we sit during the readings and the preparation of the gifts because we are being attentive to what is going on. Pews were later addition in the Catholic Church; we have only had them for about 500 years. Kneeling is a sign of humility and penitence. Within the United States it is general practice that we kneel during the Eucharistic Prayer and at Communion time as a reminder of our humility and reverence for Christ in the Eucharistic species. To go along with this is the genuflection. This also is a reminder of our humility to Christ's presence in the Eucharist, which is why we genuflect to the tabernacle as we enter and leave the church. So, as we stand, sit, and kneel at the different points of the Mass, the actions are not just to keep us awake, but they help us to give witness to the different ways that we honor Christ.



A summary from the April 19th meeting. Organization Report was from the CCW. They met in February at the ReRun Shop, served the Ecumenical Good Friday luncheon, and held a joint potluck with the CD of A with an antique road show as the program. They cashed a CD to help pay for the refinishing of the 6 candlesticks. Unfinished Business: RAGBRAI plans are underway. Father plans on having Mass for riders on both Monday evening and Tuesday morning. New Business: Parish Council Elections. Rick Brown and Retta Baker's terms are up this year. Committee Reports: Building/Grounds/Safety: Several Knights will be helping removing the drywall in rectory basement (where AA meets). Anchor Walls will be coming in May to begin waterproofing the Knights will help again after Anchor basement. Walls are finished. The old trailer on the school grounds will be removed or sold. Family Life: Coffee and rolls will resume in October. Social Concerns: Lining up people to help with Meals of the Heartland on April 21st. 
