

FROM FR. KEN

If you are reading this on the weekend, that means that we made it through another one of the predictions for the End of the World! The Rapture was to begin on Thursday the 21st one month after the eclipse, and the end of the world on Saturday the 23^{rd} . I have been getting spam emails about this for the last month and a half! This email states that they predicted it through reading the Bible and figuring out all of the signs. There is one problem with this, if you read the Bible, Jesus Himself tells us that we cannot know the time when the end of the world will happen! The other problem is that what many call the "Rapture" is not ever said in the bible, it is something that became popular in the 1830's. People often look at what is going on in our world, and then think that since there are hurricanes, earthquakes, wars, violence, discord, etc, that this must be the end. Yes, we have many problems in our world, some of them are natural disasters, and some of them are things that we do ourselves. Some of our natural disasters are because we build cities in coastal areas that are prone to hurricanes. Wars and violence happen because we cannot get along with each other, we fail in the primary message of Jesus Christ, which is to love one another as He has loved us. Even with all of this going on, if we read history, we see the many other predictions of the end, in the 1300's over one third of Europe died of the plague. They thought that it was the end, but we continued on. The point is not to try and predict the end of the world, but to be ready for it whenever it does happen, with regular confessions, Mass, and staying close to Christ by loving others as He does.

PARISH COUNCIL RECAP

September 19 meeting: Orginazation Report: The Knights of Columbus took 18 servers to an I-Cubs game in August; they have given St. Malachy teachers and the RE department cash donations; 35 men attend the summer stag; they helped replace the Pro-Life billboard north of town; served ice cream and floats at the Food Fair; will hold their Tootsie Roll drive Homecoming weekend and serve breakfast after Mass on October 8th. Unfinished Business: Waiting on diocesan approval to move along with retaining wall and cement work at the church. We are meeting with Ball Team regarding the addition to the school. Early October we will learn the results of our grant request to Dekko. Father hopes to get to Atchison this fall to do research on the early history of St. Malachy School. Food Fair was a successful day. No financial report available yet. New Business: We plan to have a float in the lighted Christmas parade on November 30th. We would like to see families walk with their children in the parade. Christmas Dinner will be served again this year. Committee Reports: Building and Grounds: Parish office will be reroofed; cracks have been filled in the court yard of the school. Family Life: Coffee and rolls served September 17th and will be served October 15th and November 19th. The newcomer packet for Mike and Karan Ripperger was handed out. Social Concerns: Served 60 at Open Table in August. We will have names for the Giving Tree again this year. Liturgy: Meeting again in November. Finance: Work projects mentioned above discussed; a disbursement was taken from the Pesik investment funds for operating expenses. Faith Formation: RE classes have begun; high school kicks off in October; 10 students and two chaperones will be attending NCYC. St. Malachy School: 98 families in school; 150 students; painting and updates made in the school over the summer; start of school family picnic well attended. RCIA: Classes will start September 21st - we know of 3 interested persons.
