

FROM FR. KEN

Sometimes during the school year, I teach the middle schoolers in their religion class, and it is called "Father Fridays" because I usually do them on Friday. I usually open the class with a chance for the students to ask questions and one of the more popular topics is exorcisms! The kids are curious about them, because they are mysterious and a bit scary. I think that they are also interested in them because of movies and TV shows. One of the interesting things is that some of the movies about exorcisms are actually based on true stories, in fact, one of them was loosely based on an exorcism case that happened in Earling, Iowa. Within the Church there are two categories of exorcisms, major and minor. What the movies portray are major exorcisms, this is when someone is possessed by a demon. Rest assured, while real possessions do actually happen, they are extremely rare! I have a classmate of mine who is the exorcist for another diocese and he has told me some stories, wow! But, most commonly there are minor exorcisms and we do them oftentimes without even knowing about it. The basic definition of an exorcism is to cast out evil and invite God into something or someone. Whenever we dip our hand into the Holy Water and do the sign of the cross on ourselves, this is a minor exorcism. When we do this, we invite God into our hearts by blessing ourselves. In baptism, we do a prayer of exorcism during the ceremony right before we do the blessing of the Holy Water. When we do a blessing of a house, we cast out the devil and all of his minions and invite the host of angels into it. The wearing of a blessed scapular is another one. The great thing, that while the devil is real, he trembles at the sight of God!

CHRIST OUR LIFE CONFERENCE



What is it? A mission project which converts livestock donated by producers into meat for the hungry. Where will the meat come from? If you are a farmer, you can donate animals for processing. You will receive a receipt for a charitable contribution based on the full market price of the usable carcass weight.

How do I donate? Contact Ruby Stephens (782-7327) or any committee member so that an appointment can be made with the certified locker. All meat must/will be inspected to insure it's safety. A recap of the September 18th meeting: Unfinished Business: School: The project was completed on time with minor touch up and outdoor work to be finished. Fencing will need to be added around the mechanical and electric boxes. Classes began in the new addition on the 17th. Food Fair: To date income is \$5,750.00 slightly down from last year. Ticket money will continue to come in and most invoices will not be received until the end of the month. Beautiful day, good crowd but might have been slightly down, everything went well. Great evening. Pictorial Directory: We will schedule photography in December when college kids are home for break. Committee Reports: Buildings, Grounds, Safety: We have received a check from Catholic Mutual from storm damage to the tile roof and fascia. Renaissance Roofing, a company out of Omaha that specializes in tile roofs, will be making the needed repairs. Phyllis Allen and Steve Heffern will attend the Emergency Planning Meeting the diocese is holding in Des Moines. Family Life: Great turn out for September coffee and rolls. October 21st will serve again. The Mahoney visit has been scheduled. Social Concerns: The committee served 65 at Open Table. November 4th we will help at the Food Pantry. We will participate in the Adopt-A-Family at Christmas Program again this year. Liturgy: The church has been decorated for fall. Doing research for tables/storage in the vestibule. Finance: Committee met on September 17th. The Diocesan Capital Campaign is coming to a close. Phyllis Allen audited the parish books per diocesan regulations. Bank accounts were reviewed. We have had two AC units go out this summer. The system is old and we will need to budget for replacing units. School/RE: School off to a good start. We are up 6 students in K-8 from last year. 28 children in the 4 year preschool and 23 in the 3 year old program. RE started September 19th and High School Youth Group will begin September 26th. We have two families in the RCIA Class with 3 others interested.


