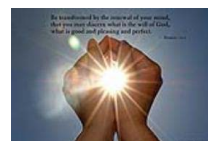

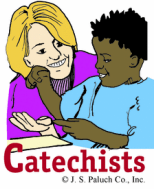
Holy Stitches is hosting a Yard Sale, Craft Sale, and Vendor Fair, Good Shepherd Social Hall, September 20th, 8am until???

Welcome to our Community! We invite you to register at the Church Office during office hours, pickup a Welcome Packet in the Gathering Area or online at: www.good-shepherd-church.org

Though a rather simple act, registration is a sign of one's commitment and responsibility to the parish and allows the parish to know how many families live in the parish. It also provides an official record of your **active membership** and is essential for participation in parish programs and sacraments.

What is an **Active Membership**: three points determine active membership:

- Registration in the parish for a sufficient period of time and use of the envelope system in support of the parish;
- Faithful attendance at Mass on Sundays and Holy Days;
- Volunteer and participate in Parish activities with time, talent, and treasure as means permit.

Please note the Facilities and Services of Good Shepherd Church are available to active members.

Emergencies: In cases of emergency, please contact the Parish Office during regular business hours. After hours, please call Deacon Pat at (910) 818-0801.

Sick and Homebound/Hospitalized: Please notify the Parish Office when someone is ill and unable to attend Mass for any significant length of time and would like to receive Holy Communion.

"I wonder what that collection's for?"

There are several parish/community-centered 2nd collection envelopes members of the parish will see almost every month, i.e., Parish Hall, Share Sunday, and Repairs and Improvement Fund. Have you ever wondered what they are for or how the money is distributed? Here is a brief explanation of how the parish allocates these donations.

Parish Hall is a once-a-month collection that helps pay the non-interest bearing mortgage payments for both the Parish Social Hall—which is used for many of our classes and social events, and the land purchased by Good Shepherd for St. Isidore's new church as part of our daughter parish responsibilities. We ask each family to donate \$10.00 a month towards these mortgage payments.

Share Sunday is also a once-a-month collection that is distributed to several charities and social organizations within the local area and our own parishioners in need. With a financial need among our own parishioners, the decision has been made to support this need by using a percentage of the funds collected through the Share Sunday collection. The amount available would depend on the amount collected as the other six charities we support; ALMS House, Hope House, Save the Babies, St. Isidore's Mission, CARE Clinic and St. Ann's Catholic School, will continue to receive the allotted amount to their organization quarterly.

The list of recipients and the distribution percentage is reviewed and adjusted by the Parish Council annually. Donations of food and other items are distributed to the ALMS House and Catholic Charities.

The **Repairs and Improvement** collection comes almost every month and helps primarily to defray the costs of improvements for our Church, Social Hall and grounds. This includes special targeted donations for specific improvements.

Envelope Changes—With the money that is collected

for the second collection with the Parish **Envelope Changes** Hall envelope, we pay the mortgage on the Social Hall building. We also use that money towards paying for the land that was purchased for San Isidro. In order to show this change, we are rewording the envelope to reflect both payments. Instead of seeing "My Monthly Gift for the Parish Hall", your envelope will read "Good Shepherd Social/Education Building/San Isidro Property Debt" We will also be changing the "Church/Social Hall Improvements" envelope to "Parish Capital Improvements".

Both envelope changes will begin with your October mailing.
